Meet the Montier Family of Cheltenham Township

Join us as we welcome Prof. Reginald Pitts, State University of New York, who will introduce us to the Montier family. The family is descended from the youngest child of local planter and Philadelphia merchant, Richard Morrey, son of the first mayor of Philadelphia. In 1746, Richard deeded to Cremona, his "Negro Woman Mooney," 200 acres of land centering on the present intersection of Limekiln Pike and Willow Grove Avenue including a burial ground. The family and ancestral home were featured in a recent WHYY documentary. Descendants will be present for Q & A.
