

The regular meeting of the Twinning Committee was held tonight, Chair James McCann, III, presiding. Members present were Penny Geikler and Mary Washington. Staff present was Nancy K. Gibson, Public Information Officer.

1. Upon motion of Ms. Washington, and approved by committee, the minutes of the October 5, 2011, meeting were accepted.

2. Under **Lottery Report**, Mr. McCann reported seven winners in October, for a total payout of \$200. Ms. Gibson distributed the 2012 lottery tickets. Mr. McCann asked members to remain after the meeting to pull the numbers purchased last year to be mailed to the same people this year. He also asked members to give him the addresses for potential buyers that members don't regularly see. Ms. Washington reported that she sold one 2011 ticket at the Harvest Festival to a woman visiting the area for cancer treatment. If the ticket is a winner, she asked for a note to be added with the payment.

3. Under Project Reports, the following items were discussed:

A. **Twining Fingerpost Sign**: Mr. McCann downloaded information from Innovative Signs for an outdoor sign that could be staked at the bottom of the fingerpost. He recommended the Durabronze product, a less-expensive imitation bronze, in the 12" x 8" size (\$398) in the bronze metal color, plus the garden stake (\$60). Manufacture time is four to six weeks. He also suggested adding the title "Cheltenham Twining Fingerpost" to the sign. Ms. Gibson will create a mockup of the sign at that size to see if the type size for the current wording would be legible. Ms. Washington will investigate what Hibberts can offer in outdoor signs.

B. **Twining Archive**: Ms. Gibson inquired about keeping some archive material in a photo/scrapbook that can be taken to events. Members approved of the idea. Mr. McCann gave copies of a photo from the fingerpost dedication ceremony to members. He also had photos of

the post after delivery at Rowland Community Center and when the “fingers” were installed, which can be added to a fingerpost photo album. Ms. Gibson has photos from the post’s installation but must get some printed to add to the photo album. Altogether, a fingerpost photo album should be able to accommodate about 40 photos.

**C. Exchanges:**

*i. Boy Scout:* Ms. Geikler reported that Norman Shore, a leader of a Wyncote Boy Scout group, would like to establish a link with a UK counterpart. Mr. McCann will follow up.

*iv. Gym:* No report.


*v. Arcadia Trip (March 12-16, 2012) and Invitation to Cheltenham UK (May 22-24, 2012):* Ms. Gibson advised members that Cheltenham UK has invited Township representatives to visit for the Olympic torch’s passage through Cheltenham UK on May 22-24, 2012. A discussion was held about appropriate presentations for this and the Arcadia trip. Upon motion of Ms. Geikler, and approved by committee, the committee recommended a framed 8 x 10 photo from the Twinning Fingerpost Dedication with an explanatory note to be the presentation for the Arcadia Trip, with the cost not to exceed \$50. Upon motion of Ms. Geikler, and approved by committee, the committee recommended a framed certificate commemorating the occasion of the Olympic torch to be the presentation for the May trip. If the Township is unable to accept the invitation for the May trip, both presentations could be delivered on the Arcadia trip.

4. Under *Old Business*, the following items were reported:

A. Ms. Washington reported selling a Centennial throw at the Community Harvest Festival.

B. Ms. Gibson reported she is awaiting a reply from Ms. Wight regarding a UK contact for the Auxiliary Police.

5. There being no further business, upon motion of Ms. Washington, and approved by committee, the meeting was adjourned.
