AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CHELTENHAM,  
CHAPTER 285 THEREOF, ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, BY AMENDING CERTAIN  
STREET AND PARKING REGULATIONS.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of Cheltenham hereby ordains:

**SECTION 1.** The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article IV, entitled Schedule of Traffic Regulations, Section 285-43 thereof is hereby amended by **ADDING** the following:

LYCOMING AVENUE

**SECTION 2.** The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article IV, entitled Schedule of Traffic Regulations, Section 285-43 thereof is hereby amended by **ADDING** the following:

LYCOMING AVENUE           (1)     STOP STREET at Glenwood Road; at Lenape Avenue

**SECTION 3.** The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article IV, entitled Schedule of Traffic Regulations, Section 285-43 thereof is hereby amended by **DELETING** the following:

CREST AVENUE               (7)     HANDICAPPED PARKING, south side, 30 feet east of Oak Avenue to 50 feet east of Oak Avenue. This addition is effective for the duration period that this resident is eligible for a reserved handicapped parking sapce.

**SECTION 4.** That in all other respects Chapter 285 of the Code of the Township of Cheltenham is hereby approved and accepted as amended, and shall continue in full force and effect.

**SECTION 5.** This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval as required by law.

**ENACTED** into an Ordinance this **15<sup>th</sup>** day of April, 2015.

Butcher St. Investigation: A resident banged on the door of the fire company reporting she heard a loud crack and believed it was from the attached house which was under going renovations. The fire company investigated to find the attached dwelling had partially fallen and appeared compromised. The homeowner was advised she could not stay at her house as there appeared to be a serious d=structural issue. Numerous township departments were contacted for follow-up. The attached dwelling was temporarily stabilized but both units not permitted to be occupied until more permanent repairs are made. Cheltenham Avenue; Shopping Center. Companies has a report of fumes inside a strip shopping center. High levels of Carbon Monoxide were found in numerous attached stores. Companies searched for the source while ventilating the building. PECO was contacted and arrived to pinpoint the source. Typically these incidents demand time and personnel due to the many occupancies and sources within each.

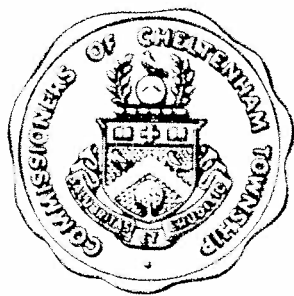
