Summary of Significant Incidents

- 5/7 5:53AM Cheltenham Ave: Commercial Building. Companies were dispatched to a report of a fire in the deli of a grocery store. Upon arrival companies found a fire in cooking equipment that had been extinguished by an employee using a handheld extinguisher. Companies ensured extinguishment. As was done at this incident the county health department is notified of a fire that occurs around cooking operations. In this instance any food in the areas that may have been exposed to smoke or extinguishing agent is removed and destroyed. All surfaces must be cleaned before operations can resume.
- 5/7 6:00PM Cheltenham Ave: Construction site. A caller reported smoke from a store at Cheltenham Avenue and Washington Lane. Companies arrived and located an extinguished fire in a construction site that had been started with gasoline. Police who had been in the area when the fire was reported chased and apprehended juveniles seen fleeing the site. The fire had been in an area undergoing demolition and had caused no appreciable damage.
- 5/10 9:28PM Roosevelt Ave: Dwelling. Upon arrival at a dwelling fire companies found an extinguished fire with a smoke condition. The fire had started when a knocked over candle ignited contents in a bathroom. This is the third fire in a bathroom in less than a year ignited from candles. Companies checked for any fire extension and ventilated the dwelling of smoke.
- 5/19 9:41AM Erlen Road: Dwelling. Companies responded to resident reporting their house on fire. Upon arrival smoke was banked down to the floor on the second level of the dwelling. Companies ventilated windows to vent smoke and locate the fire. The fire involved the contents of a second floor bedroom. One bedroom suffered fire and heat damage. A tremendous amount of smoke and soot damage occurred on the second floor. This due mostly to burning plastics. The resident and household pets escaped. The dwelling is uninhabitable until repairs can be made.
- 5/30 5:13PM Heather Rd: Rescue. In an unusual incident the fire company was dispatched to an incident where someone got their fingers stuck in a blender. It took little time to disentangle the fingers. The injuries were minor.

I continued working with the Montgomery County Communications Department on the programming of our new portable and mobile radios. These should be delivered in the next several months. There is currently testing in process and hopefully they can be delivered next month.

We have been working for several months to purchase battery operated litters. These items allow for raising and lowering of the litter with out straining back muscles. These items have to be installed and should be in-service during August.

We have submitted to the Police Department a suggested blood draw policy for their consideration. Our Paramedics will be working with the Police Department in drawing blood from potential DUI drivers. Once operational, these administrative procedures will save trips to the hospital and have officers on patrol more quickly.
