Attached for your review is a copy of the October 2017 monthly Fire Department response statistics to be included in the Fire Marshal's report to the Public Safety Committee.

Additionally the township Fire Companies routinely give fire prevention programs and participate in displays throughout the year. However October is also known as Fire Prevention Month. (Why? This was the month the great Chicago Fire of 1871 occurred in. Fire Prevention week is the week that contains the 9<sup>TH</sup> day which is the date on which the fire started) During this month, when prevention is in the spotlight, more programs are given than at any other time of the year.

In October the fire companies gave fire prevention programs to the young at schools and day care sites throughout the township. While getting the message across to the young is paramount, statistics show the message needs to get across to all age groups. To get the message to a broader audience both the Glenside and Elkins Park Fire Companies hosted an open house at their respective stations with fire prevention displays, activities and demonstration. In addition the Cheltenham Fire Company hosted its annual live firefighting demonstration and display at the Gottschalk Training Grounds. And the La Mott Fire Company participated with a fire prevention display at safety day at the Cheltenham Home Depot.

While the majority of the time and effort goes towards presenting programs during Fire Prevention Month, programs are given throughout the year. Groups are encouraged to reach out to the companies or the Fire Marshal's Office for a program. Every effort will be made to accommodate requests to get the fire safety message across.

**Summary of Selected Incidents**

**10/5 4:52AM**  
 Fenton Rd: Dwelling Fire. Companies arrived with a rear two story deck well involved in fire. Fire had spread into the dwelling. Numerous hand lines were deployed to extinguish the fire. The fire had extended into the kitchen and attic before being controlled. The entire living area suffered severe smoke damage. The lone occupant awoke and saw the fire outside the kitchen window. By the time she dialed 911 the fire had entered and was burning in the kitchen. She escaped uninjured. One pet succumbed to the smoke.  
 Cheltenham Ave: Construction Site, Rescue. Fire and EMS units were dispatched to a person with a medical issue on the roof of a building under construction. The patient could not use a ladder due to a medical issue taking place. Companies used on site lift equipment to access and remove the patient who was treated and transported by EMS.

**10/11 2:00PM**  
 Church Road, Building Fire. An automatic fire alarm was received from a secondary school campus building that housed administrative offices and dormitories. Upon arrival the engine company reported smoke showing from the building. Fire was found issuing from a basement window. Crews forced entry and advanced a hose line into the basement to extinguish a fire in a computer server and service area. The room suffered heavy fire and smoke damage. The concrete construction of the floor above kept the fire from extending upwards. As taught the residents had evacuated when the fire alarm sounded. Most were unaware there was an active fire.

Attached please find our Operational Report for the month of November 2017. Our financial, detail, and statistical report for the month of October 2017 is also attached.

During the month our two (2) power lift lifters were received. One can be installed by our staff, while the other has to go to the dealer for installation. We hope both can be completed during the month of December.

Also during the month, our ALS Coordinator Jerry Speed and Paramedic Josh Williams did an outstanding job of acquiring and installing our new (required) trip sheet computer software. Additionally, they saved the Township a considerable amount of money by arranging to have our staff trained in conjunction with Lafayette Ambulance (Upper Merion Township) and Whitmarsh Ambulance. The new program will be operational during the first two weeks of December. An additional benefit to the new software is it provides access to our billing department allowing for easier data collection.

We worked with the Police Department during the month to finalize allowing paramedics to draw blood on drivers suspected of being under the influence (DUI). We will begin assisting the Police on December 1, 2017. This new policy will save time as the suspects will no longer have to be transported to the hospital for the blood to be drawn. Additionally, EMS will be able to bill for our services.
