Summary of Significant Incidents

1/7-1/11

Bitter cold and snow kept fire companies busy at the beginning of January. Calls related to the weather included many investigations and hazard control for broken pipes in houses and businesses, downed trees into buildings, failed PECO equipment and heating related issues. Many of these days companies responded to multiple calls for service.

1/8 7:38PM

Rices Mill Road: Companies responded to a dwelling fire indirectly related to the bitter cold. A resident repairing frozen pipes with a torch accidentally ignited concealed wood structural members. Companies had to remove interior walls and exterior siding to gain access to and control the fire.

1/14 8:08AM

Myrtle Ave: Companies responded for a reported dwelling fire. The fire started in the basement dryer. Residents alerted by a smoke detector tried to use an extinguisher but had to evacuate due to the growing fire. Arriving fire companies quickly controlled the fire. There was smoke damage throughout. The house was uninhabitable due to the damage. Dryer fires are a typical cause of structure fires in Cheltenham as well as nationally. The occupants, including an infant, were on the upper floor of the house when the fire occurred. Working smoke detectors once again proved their worth.

Attached please find our Operational Report for February of 2014. Our financial, detail, and statistical report for January of 2014 are also attached. It should be noted that for January we were unable to track the Officer responses to calls and the number of calls covered by mutual aid. This is due to the County's upgrade to the Computer aided dispatch (CAD) system. This data should again be available for our March statistics.

During the month snow and severe weather continued to be our biggest issue. The EMS staff did an excellent job during these difficult times. Members volunteered for overtime to insure that we had two advanced life support (ALS) crews during the worst times. Assistant Chief Smaltimi and Lieutenant Barto assisted the Emergency Management team at the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and in the field with various functions.

We received specifications from a vendor for the remounting of our oldest ambulance body on a new chassis. This project is being spearheaded by our longtime engineer Charles Fluehr. Some further refinements are needed prior to our going to bid.

Due to the weather, our staff did not meet with the Police Department to further investigate EMS entering the warm zone during active shooter incidents. This project will be pursued in March, weather permitting

Due to a business trip that was rescheduled due to snow, I will be unable to attend your meeting. Please contact me if you have any questions.

Attached is the Emergency Management report for February of 2014. The report of the Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator is also attached.

- The winter weather was the continued focus of the team during the month. We worked with all departments to insure safety for our residents and employees.
 - The Facebook page continues to be a great success with some posts reaching over 4,000 people. At the request of various residents we have begun work on creating a Twitter page.
 - While the County has reached the dollar total required for relief, no decision has yet been made if this will become available for the public or private sector.
 - Deputy Coordinator Kirschner ability to work with the School District was curtailed due to the weather. She returned to the District at the end of the month to continue working on their EMA plans.
 - During the storms we recognized certain unmet needs that inhibited the team. We have been working with the Manager to rectify these issues.
- We continue to work with Arcadia University to better integrate with their Public Safety Department. At the end of February we were able to program some of our radios to work on their system, thus allowing better communications during emergencies.
- Our staff will be assisting the Five County Task Force with the 2014 National Homeland Security Conference which will be held in Philadelphia on May 20, 21, and 22. This is a National Conference and should be good exposure for the Team
