**Summary of Significant Incidents**

1/8 4:58PM Church Rd: Chimney Fire. Companies arrived with a wood stove flue on fire. The resident called when the flue started glowing red and smoking. Companies extinguished the fire in the flue and checked for extension during bitter cold. While flues are made to contain heat, debris igniting within the flue can burn extremely hot and destroy the flue exposing the building construction to direct flames. In this instance the fire was extinguished with no extension to the dwelling.

1/10 12:51PM Church Rd: Apartment Fire: Companies arrived with smoke showing from the third floor of an occupied apartment house converted to condominiums. Companies evacuated residents and stretched hose lines to extinguish the fire. Extensive overhaul was conducted to ensure fire had not traveled into concealed spaces. The fire unit suffered severe damage. With the exception of the fire unit and two nearby units all occupants were permitted to return the next day after emergency repairs were made.

1/19 04:28AM S. John Russell Ct: Apartment Fire: Heavy smoke outside was reported by an apartment complex resident. Police located a fire in a nearby apartment building. On arrival companies had fire showing from a first and second floor unit and in the common roof. An aggressive fire attack with numerous hose lines controlled the fire. There was one fire victim found on the second floor who has succumbed to the fire. The fire occurred during a period of severe cold and ice.

Various Bitter cold and snow kept fire companies busy at the beginning of January. Calls related to the weather included many investigations and hazard control for broken pipes in houses and businesses, downed trees into buildings, failed PECO equipment and heating related issues. Many days companies responded to multiple calls for service.

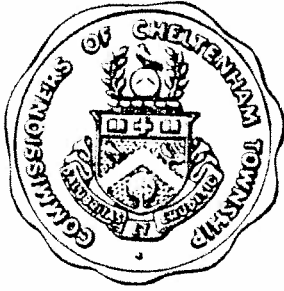

Attached is the Emergency Management report for February 2015. The report of the Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator is also attached.

- New portable radios were received on the Public Work's frequency. These radios will be issued to Fire, Police and EMS during storm emergencies to better facilitate communications. The radios will also be available for use by the Public Works department.
- I responded twice during the month to assist Public Works with spills into the Tookany Creek in the Wyncote area. We contacted the DEP and the PA Fish Commission who also responded. The spill was traced back to Jenkintown and was handled by DEP.
- On the 21<sup>st</sup> of the month at the request of Fire Chief Kevin Lynch and I responded to Brookview at Elkins Park to assist the Fire Department. They had been called for an investigation and found frozen water pipes and holes in walls caused by the pipes. The electrical system was flickering and after consulting with Fire and P&Z 28 units were evacuated. We all met with management the day after the incident was first reported, corrections were made and the residents allowed to return.
- On the same evening as the above incident, I was requested to respond to Butcher Street for a possible house collapse. I responded with Hack Wacker and we found, due to unpermitted work being done, half of a duplex was in danger of falling. The resident of the other half of the twin was evacuated and the building was marked as uninhabitable. Engineering and P&Z followed up on Monday the 23<sup>rd</sup>.

- Attended the Fire Board meeting and EDITS planning meeting.
- Held two (2) meetings with the Deputy Coordinator and the residents of Bickley Road who are involved in the PEMA/FEMA buyouts. This was an initial meeting to explain the processes to those involved.
- Held a meeting with the Deputy Coordinator and the Township Solicitor. This was an initial meeting to explain the processes and where we will need legal representation.
