**Summary of Significant Incidents**

**Various**

Appliance Fires: In an effort to reduce response assignments the Montgomery County Emergency Dispatch Center created three new response categories. Cheltenham Township was a proponent of and urged the change. The three categories included a new "Appliance Fire". The category includes any 911 calls where the caller reports a moveable appliance is on fire. Previously any call where an appliance was located inside a building were dispatched as a building response. All 4 appliance fires listed in September were for grease fires contained within ranges. All were safely extinguished with some responses also requiring ventilation of smoke. Previously 4 engines and two ladders would have responded. The new response now receives 2 engines and 1 ladder. The 911 call taker can, will and has upgraded a response based on the caller information. (For example a caller reported a toaster oven on fire and the cabinets starting to burn) The change took place in 2016 and has reduced the burden on companies and responders.

Attached please find our Operational Report for the month of October 2017. Our financial, detail, and statistical report for the month of September 2017 are also attached.

During the month our two power lift litters were received. One can be installed by our staff, while the other has to go to the dealer for installation. We hope both can be completed during the month of December.

On October 1, 2017 all of our rates for transportation increased with the approval of the Board of Commissioners. It will take several months to see the results from this increase. During the month our yearly subscription was sent to the printer and mail house. It should be received by residents in early November.

During the month we were notified by the Commonwealth (via Montgomery County EMS) that the trip sheet program we are currently using will no longer be certified after December 31, 2017. The manufacturer has decided not to make the required changes to comply with Pennsylvania State requirements. Just under half of the EMS services in the County were left in the same predicament. Paramedics Jerry Speed and Josh Williams did an outstanding (and prompt) job of evaluating all of the available certified computer programs. A program was selected and a purchase order written. In addition, Paramedics Speed and Williams learned that two other local agencies will be purchasing the same software and are willing to train together. This will cut our training costs by two-thirds and make more time available for our staff to train.

I worked with DIVIT personnel on a safety inspection of the EMS building. A few very minor issues were noted and addressed immediately.

- Developed several drafts of a proposed EMA brochure for public distribution
- Moved and programmed mobile sign / message boards for several township functions
- Attended safety meetings and emergency plan review for the following schools: Glenside Elementary, Wyncote Elementary & Cheltenham High School
- Met with School District representative to discuss updating safety plans
- Two separate site visits at Germantown Friends for building emergency operations plan development
- Completed three Germantown Friends Building Emergency Plans
- Attended webinar for regional fuel study assessment
- Worked on flood gates to replace old lights and check batteries
- Printed several ID cards for staff / contractors
- Worked on several cell phone issues for staff
- Monthly cable / internet and phone bill

## What is Emergency Management ?

The primary role of Cheltenham Township Emergency Management is to coordinate response and recovery efforts of multiple agencies. These agencies include Township partners such as the Police Department, Public Works Department, Fire Department, Emergency Medical Service, as well as many outside agencies such as PECO and the American Red Cross.

In recent years our team has assisted in several large scale events including Hurricane Irene, Super Storm Sandy, 1600 Church Rd Fire and Winter Storm Jonas. Our department maintains plans, procedures and equipment in order to help the community stay safe during such events.



Above is one example of our ongoing mitigation efforts. The gate pictured, is one of ten flood gates that are strategically located throughout the Township. These gates can be lowered during hazardous weather conditions in order to eliminate cars from driving into potentially dangerous roadways.

### School Safety is a Top Priority

For more than four years, our Emergency Management Team has been working with The Cheltenham School District to develop & implement emergency response plans for our schools. A comprehensive emergency plan was developed for each building. The plans were then condensed into easy to read, age appropriate posters, which are prominently displayed in each classroom.

To ensure that staff and students are familiar with the plan, regular meetings, trainings and drills are conducted throughout the year. The culmination of these training was a full scale drill at Elkins Park Middle School in October of 2015. Employees from every department in the Township and school district took part in the drill.

While each discipline regularly trains on their own, a full scale drill of this magnitude provided an opportunity to practice as a team. The scenario, which involved a simulated explosion, included hundreds of participants, including drill monitors and volunteer student "victims,"

### How We Prepare to Help You

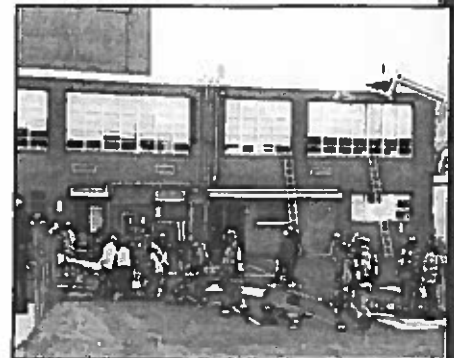


Ensuring that Cheltenham Township is ready to successfully respond to and recover from disasters, both natural and manmade, is our top priority.

Cheltenham's Emergency Management team is always working behind the scenes to ensure the community's safety. Throughout the year, the team reviews new and existing plans from schools, religious institutions, shopping centers, nursing homes and other large-scale facilities. During these reviews team members update contact information and double-check the procedures outlines in the emergency plans. Each year these plans are tested.

The team regularly conducts table-top drills at the Emergency Operations Center, pictured below, with other public safety departments and local partners. Emergency Management personnel also speak to residents and community groups about steps they can take to be prepared.

In the event of a large-scale incident, Cheltenham Emergency Management could need help. That is why the team often trains and works with surrounding Townships and the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety. Other partners include local agencies such as schools and religious institution, which could offer shelter space and other assistance during disasters.

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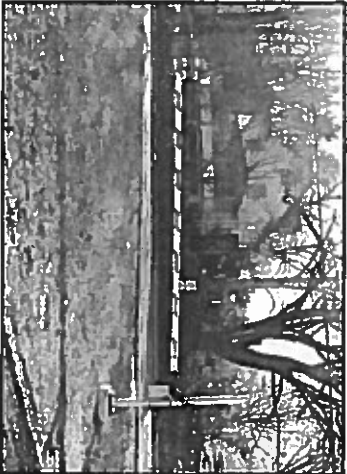
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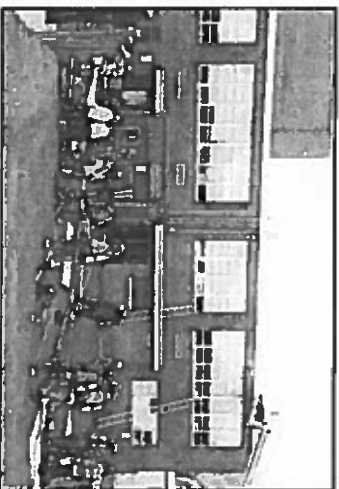
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
