ORDINANCE NO. ____-17

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CHELTENHAM,
CHAPTER 285 THEREOF, ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, BY AMENDING CERTAIN
STREET AND PARKING REGULATIONS.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of Cheltenham hereby ordains:

SECTION 1. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article IV, entitled Schedule of Traffic Regulations, Section 285-43 thereof is hereby amended by **DELETING** the following:

MT. CARMEL AVENUE (14) HANDICAPPED PARKING, in front of 148 Mt. Carmel Avenue

SECTION 2. That in all other respects Chapter 285 of the Code of the Township of Cheltenham is hereby approved and accepted as amended, and shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval as required by law.

ENACTED into an Ordinance this 17th day of May, 2017.

Summary of Significant Incidents

2/15 11:11AM **New Second St: Dwelling.** Companies responding for a fire alarm in a dwelling arrived with light smoke showing from the front of the residence. The response was upgraded to a building fire adding additional units to the call. Companies forced entry and found a smoldering fire in logs that had been previously removed from a fireplace. The dwelling was ventilated. The homeowner had cleaned out the fireplace and forgot to remove the debris to the outside prior to leaving for work.

2/16 11:15AM **Easton Road: Apartment Fire.** A contractor working across the street from a commercial building saw smoke coming from a second floor window in a four story building. He alerted the business on the first floor who called 911. He and another person banged on the door of the fire apartment. Hearing no response they entered the unit and found a disoriented person who was evacuated from the unit. They used a portable fire extinguisher on a small fire in the apartment but had to leave due to the smoke. Responding companies completed extinguishment and ventilated the building. The occupant was transported to the hospital, treated for smoke inhalation and released later that day.

2/21 12:51PM **Mather Way: Apartment Fire.** Companies responded a report of a smoke detector sounding in an apartment attached to the 911 callers unit. First arriving police reported smoke showing from a first floor apartment. The police also had a report of a person possibly inside as well as the apartment labeled with oxygen in use. Upon forcing entry the police could not get in due to the smoke but two dogs ran out. The fire was confined to a stovetop. Cooking fires can create tremendous amounts of smoke depending on what is burning. Arriving companies needed breathing apparatus to enter and ventilate the unit of smoke. A search showed the unit was unoccupied. Companies noted many oxygen cylinders within the unit as well as liquid oxygen. The tenant had correctly labeled the door to alert any responders to the potential hazard inside.

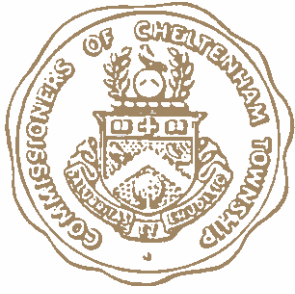
