COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, TO AMEND THE CODE OF
THE TOWNSHIP OF CHELTENHAM, CHAPTER 285
THEREOF, ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, BY
AMENDING CERTAIN STREET AND PARKING
REGULATIONS.**

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of Cheltenham hereby ordains:

SECTION 1. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, entitled "Vehicles and traffic," Article IV, entitled "Schedule of traffic regulations," Section 285-43, entitled "Street and parking regulations" thereof is hereby amended by **DELETING** the following:

HANDICAPPED PARKING	(J) Handicapped parking in front of 1806 Beech Avenue, La Mott
	(8) Handicapped parking in front of 1808 Erlen Road, La Mott

SECTION 2. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, entitled "Vehicles and traffic," Article IV, entitled "Schedule of traffic regulations," Section 285-43, entitled "Street and parking regulations" thereof is hereby amended by **ADDING** the following:

HANDICAPPED PARKING	(J) Handicapped parking in front of 1810 Beech Avenue, La Mott
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SECTION 3. That in all other respects Chapter 285 of the Code of the Township of Cheltenham is hereby approved and accepted as amended, and shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval as required by law.

Summary of Significant Incidents

- 8/3 3:44AM** Willow Grove Ave; Dwelling. Companies responded to an early morning fire in a split level dwelling. Upon arrival the ground floor den was well involved with fire extending out and up the exterior walls and through concealed spaces. Numerous hand lines quickly knocked down the fire. Companies were in service for an extended period gaining access to and extinguishing fire that had extended through voids. Family members had tried unsuccessfully to extinguish the fire prior to evacuating. The four occupants were uninjured. There was severe fire damage to the ground floor. The entire house suffered heavy heat and smoke damage and was uninhabitable.
- 8/4 8:22PM** Cheltenham & Ivinetta; Vehicle fire. Numerous 911 calls were received reporting a vehicle fire near a house. Companies arrived to find a vehicle in the driveway of a house well involved in fire. Hand lines were stretched to protect the dwelling and extinguish the fire. The vehicle was a total loss. The dwelling was never involved.
- 8/10 12:39PM** Waverly Road; Dwelling. Companies were dispatched to a fire in a wall that was presumed out. Upon arrival companies found a plumber using a torch had inadvertently ignited combustible insulation backing inside a wall. The contractor had extinguished a small visible fire. Companies had to pull down the wall to effect final extinguishment. Fire had spread up the wall to the roof area. In this instance smoldering debris was still inside the wall. While the contractor did not intend nor want the fire company at the site he did the correct thing and called 911 probably preventing a significant fire.
- 8/20 5:21AM** La Mott Ave, Ab Twp; Ladder 1 responded as the Rapid Intervention Team, (RIT) to a dwelling fire in Abington Township. RIT teams have been automatically deployed to any confirmed structural fire for the last 10 years. They are solely there to intervene if other firefighters get trapped in a building. Data shows firefighters succumb in most fires when they get trapped and their air supply runs out. RIT teams have specialized training, equipment and procedure they employ to get a trapped firefighter out. In a most unusual coincidence later that day L1 responded as RIT to a second confirmed dwelling fire on the same street. The fires were unconnected.

Attached please find our Operational Report for the month of September 2017. Our financial, detail, and statistical report for the month of August 2017 are also attached.

During the month of September, Cheltenham Emergency Medical Services was recertified by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as an Advanced Life Support (ALS) Ambulance Service. This certification takes place every three years and is an arduous undertaking. We would not have successfully passed our certifications with out the diligent efforts of Captain Ken Beerger, Lt. Jessica Barto, ALS Coordinator Jerry Speed, and Acting Engineer Frank Boyle.

During the month Sabine Lovins was hired as a full-time paramedic. She brings years of experience to our team. While this brings our staffing back to a full complement, we still have two full-time staff members on medical leaves and one on military leave.
