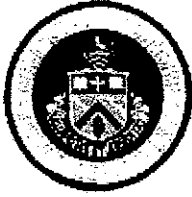

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CHELTENHAM, CHAPTER 285 THEREOF, ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, BY AMENDING CERTAIN STREET AND PARKING REGULATIONS.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of Cheltenham hereby ordains:

SECTION 1. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article II, entitled Parking Meter Zones, Section 285-20 thereof is hereby amended by **DELETING** the following:

HIGH SCHOOL ROAD South side 85 feet to 225 feet east of Montgomery Avenue.

HIGH SCHOOL ROAD Both sides Park Avenue to Montgomery Avenue.

SECTION 2. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article II, entitled Parking Meter Zones, Section 285-21 thereof is hereby amended by **DELETING** the following:

HIGH SCHOOL ROAD South side 225 feet to 405 feet east of Montgomery Avenue.

MONTGOMERY AVENUE East side 83 feet to 103 feet north of High School Road.

SECTION 3. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article IV, entitled Schedule of Traffic Regulations, Section 285-43 thereof is hereby amended by **DELETING** the following:

ERLEN ROAD (9) HANDICAPPED PARKING at 1729. This addition is effective for the duration period that this resident is eligible for a reserved handicapped parking space.

HUBER STREET (1) NO PARKING, east side, Mt. Carmel Avenue to 155 feet south.

MONTGOMERY AVENUE (8) NO PARKING, east side, High School Road to 83 feet north.

SECTION 4. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article II, entitled Parking Meter Zones, Section 285-20 thereof is hereby amended by **ADDING** the following:

HIGH SCHOOL ROAD South side Park Avenue to Montgomery Avenue.

HIGH SCHOOL ROAD North side Montgomery Avenue to 197 feet west.

HIGH SCHOOL ROAD North side Park Avenue to 89 feet east.

SECTION 5. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article II, entitled Parking Meter Zones, Section 285-21 thereof is hereby amended by **ADDING** the following:

HIGH SCHOOL ROAD South side 85 feet to 405 feet east of Montgomery Avenue.

SECTION 6. The Code of the Township of Cheltenham, Chapter 285, Article IV, entitled Schedule of Traffic Regulations, Section 285-43 thereof is hereby amended by **ADDING** the following:

Summary of Significant Incidents

9/5 12:28PM Church & York Roads: PECO Substation: CTPD on patrol observed smoke and an alarm from the substation building. Arriving companies and police set up an exclusion zone around the entire area. The station cannot be accessed until power is shut down by PECO. High voltage components and power lines are extremely dangerous an a failure could be catastrophic to anyone in the immediate area of a failure.. The incident was contained only after peck remotely shut off all incoming power to sthe substation.

9/13 10:59AM Cheltenham High School: Companies arrived with an electrical fire in the kitchen of the school. Staff correctly used an extinguisher on the fire while the school was evacuated. Damage was minimal.

9/20 08:34AM 1000 S. Easton Road: Store: Companies investigating an automatic fire alarm activation at the Cedarbrook Mall were flagged down by a business owner who found a sprinkler discharging in his business when he arrived to open. The sprinkler had activated due to a fire that had occurred in the office area of the business. One sprinkler extinguished the fire. All businesses located in the mall were able to open that day. The business reopened one week later. The business and other attached stores were no doubt saved from fire and smoke damage by the sprinkler system.

Attached please find our Operational Report for October of 2012. Our financial, detail and statistical report for September of 2012 are also attached.

This was a very busy month for Cheltenham EMS. The fire at 1600 Church Road was one of the largest that our service has responded to in its 30 year history. All of our Officers and many of our off duty staff responded to the call. During the call as many as twenty-three (23) ambulances from Bucks and Montgomery County were deployed to the scene to cover Eastern Montgomery County. Assistant Chief Smaltini, Captain Berger, and Lt. Barto did an excellent job of providing EMS command for over 24 hours. EMS continued to provide support until the incident was closed.

The second large event of the month was Hurricane Sandy. EMS Assistant Chief Smaltini did an excellent job increasing coverage during the hurricane. During the worst part of the storm we had three ALS ambulance in service. Our staff worked long hours to insure the safety of our residents. I am glad to report that there were no major injuries.

The remount of our oldest ambulance is complete and the vehicle is at the dealer in Delaware. It was due to be delivered during the first week of November. We may postpone the delivery due to Hurricane Sandy.

Attached please find the report of The Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator. In addition to her report, we participated in the following activities:

- The Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator was responsible for our Team's response to a catastrophic fire at the 1600 Church. During the thirty hour response she coordinated the efforts of the Emergency Services and the evacuation of approximately 150 residents. Her efforts continued for two weeks working with PEMA, SBA, and the volunteer group to help residents and tenants recover. When the after action has been completed, we will include a copy with our monthly report.
- On October 25th our team began working on a plan for the arrival of Hurricane Sandy. Meetings were held with the EMA staff, followed by a meeting with all of the key Township departments (held on Friday October 26th). A primary action plan was developed for a storm that was predicted to cause heavy flooding and heavy damage caused by wind. The team opened the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) at 8:00AM on Monday October 29th and it remained open and staffed through 12:00noon on October 31st. Fortunately we had no flooding events during this period. During the evening of the 29th we had high winds that caused severe damage to many properties throughout the Township. By following the plan, and with the assistance of many of the Township's departments we were able to tackle all of the issues related to the loss of electricity (at one point to two-thirds of the Township) and a large volume of road closures (due to trees and wires being down). As of this writing we continue to work with residents to insure their safe return to the homes, the resumption of electricity, and reopening all roads in the Township. Again, in the future we will submit an after action report for this event. I would be remiss if I did not thank the Emergency Management Team, the Police, Fire, and EMS departments, and

most importantly the Public Works staff for their efforts and cooperation during this event.

- Our emergency management flood vehicle was placed back in service after a mechanical failure. It was available for service (and staffed) during Hurricane Sandy.
- Thirteen Township Staff members attended the EDITS conference sponsored by the Eastern Montgomery County Emergency Management Group. Emergency Management paid for members of the Emergency Management Team, the Fire Department, and EMS staffs to attend this two day disaster management conference.

- Attending meeting and spoke with State officials regarding updated on the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program buyout program.
- Obtained more than \$225,000 from PEMA for recovery funds from Irene and Lee storm events last fall.
